# Bridges to disaster:

Amendments 60 and 61 and Proposition 101

If something sounds too good to be true, it probably is. That was the conclusion of the Aurora Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors who after carefully reviewing the provisions of proposed Amendments 60 and 61 and Proposition 101, voted to oppose them in this fall's elections.

"Lowering property and income taxes, cutting mill levies in half, drastically reducing vehicle registration and telecommunication fees, and limiting state and local debt, all sound very appealing during our continuing recession," said Chamber President Kevin Hougen in co-signing a resolution opposing the measures. "However, these taxes and fees along with the ability to borrow for projects, means jobs, infrastructure, transportation, education and quality of life. Without them, our roads and

bridges will start to fail, our teachers will see an increase in the number of students in their classroom, and nearly 70,000 jobs will be lost including nearly 8.000 teachers."

Hougen pointed out as an example

that had the provisions of Amendment 61 been in place earlier, such important projects such as the DIA construction, the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Center in Aurora, I-225 improvements, FasTracks and school

improvements in Aurora Public Schools and Cherry Creeks Schools would not have been possible.

Joining Hougen in signing the formal resolution were Chamber Board Chair Mark Moses and Public Issues Vice Chair Jeff Thompson.

# President's Letter

# Critical issues facing Colorado and Chamber

I realized this morning as I was writing this letter for the newsletter that I've been involved in business, politics and public policy for over 31 years in Colorado. Since moving

to this wonderful state in 1979, I've seen many dramatic changes. Most have been very good. But the past 27 months... well, they have been unlike anything else and I am truly worried what the future and our future leaders have in store for us.

#### **Dear Future Governor**

Our primary elections have just concluded and it appears we now know who will be on the ballot Nov 2. If I had one wish at this time, it would be a visit with our future Governor. Not that our future legislators, county commissioners and other elected officials are not important, but so much of our immediate future hangs in balance and the Governor, as the State's senior leader, can often sway that balance. Especially critical is the potential nightmare of Amendments 60 & 61 and Proposition 101, which, for the record, the Aurora Chamber Board of Directors has unanimously voted to oppose.

So, if I had the opportunity to sit down with the future governor—whoever that might be—here are some key questions I think need to be answered. And for all our benefit, I'd like to hear answers before the mail ballots are sent out on October 16th and the general election day of November 2nd:

- 1). Governor, what are you going to do to ensure that the hostile environment towards good and caring business members by those serving in the Colorado General Assembly doesn't occur next year when we come down to the Capitol to testify?
- 2). How will you become the true voice and champion of Colorado to retain and grow our aerospace industry in Colorado. And who will ensure that our military installations are protected from encroachment issues?
- 3). How will you help our struggling businesses obtain access to capital for business retention and expansion (BRE).

- 4). DIA continues to grow and expand. What will you do to ensure that we will have money to support one of our largest industries in this state—tourism? As you ponder this question, keep in mind that most of the companies that have relocated to Colorado got their first impressions when they visited here on vacation.
- 5). Colorado has a highly-educated workforce, but the Colorado Paradox is that we (myself included) have all been educated out of state. What will you do to strengthen higher education and protect P-20 (pre-school through masters programs)?

These are just a few of the many questions that need to be answered! The number one thing the Governor needs to do is create a partnership with business. Currently the business community feels we are being treated as the enemy. In reality businesses are the engine of successful governments. Without partnerships we will never have the confidence in our entrepreneurs to risk the capital to create the next employee. It's time for different approaches to unlock our potential and jolt our economy back to life!

#### NO on 60, 61 and 101

One last comment, as I alluded to earlier, please take the time to read and study the potential damaging effects that Amendments 60 & 61 along with Proposition 101 will have on Colorado! If any of these had been around just a few short years ago we would not have in the eastern metro area: Denver International Airport... E-470... Southlands... Heritage Eagle Bend... Saddle Rock... Prairie Waters Project... Anschutz Medical Campus... successful Bond Elections at Aurora Public Schools and Cherry Creek School... T-REX... the Alameda Interchange... I-225 upgrades... FASTRACKS light rail... just to name a few!

What will we have if these "poison pills" are passed? More than 70,000 more unemployed citizens... more than 8,000 teachers will lose their jobs... the Arapahoe County Libraries will be forced to close or reduce services by 40 percent... RTD will effectively close down,... the state budget of \$18.2 billion will be reduced by \$4.2 billion... and I can go on and on!!

# Rebates on energy efficiency upgrades available through April 2011

It's a great time for Aurora Chamber members to make significant energy efficiency improvements to their properties, because The City of Aurora has nearly \$1 million for rebates and incentives to defray the costs associated with making energy efficiency or renewable energy upgrades to a property in Aurora. The rebates are provided through Federal stimulus funds from the U.S. Department of Energy.

For Aurora business owners, these rebates could provide a savings of up to \$1,500 for material costs, and depending on the project, total savings could be as high as \$3,000, because the rebate is layered on top of existing Xcel Energy rebates.

Qualifying materials include lighting, insulation, air and duct sealing, high-efficiency furnaces, boilers, evaporative coolers, rooftop air conditioners, condensing units, data center cooling systems, energy management systems and more.

In addition, in partnership with the Governor's Energy Office, the city is offering a rebate for solar hot water heating systems, which can drop water heating bills from 50 to 80 percent. Commercial property owners can receive up to \$15,000 depending on the size and cost of the system.

Finally, the city of Aurora will rebate energy audit costs and permit fees associated with installing a complete solar installation of any kind. The city is offering these rebates and incentives through April, 2011. For a searchable database of the rebates and incentives available to Aurora business owners, visit www.rechargecolorado.com.

# I-225 and Colfax/17th Place interchange funded

The **City of Aurora** recently received more than \$16 million in funding to complete the final phases of the I-225 and Colfax Avenue/17th Place interchange that will serve the Anschutz Medical Campus and Fitzsimons Life Science District. The Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG) Board of Directors approved the funding from the Additional FY 2010-2011 Formula Funds, allowing completion of Phases 3 and 4. Phase 3 includes the completion of a slip ramp, providing access to southbound I-225 from 17th Place as well as the 17th Place bridge providing access between Fitzsimons and I-225. Phase 4 includes the portion of the 17th Place bridge that allows two-way traffic to travel over I-225

and it will create access points both to and from the bridge for northbound I-225. The new interchange has an overall price tag of approximately \$46 million.

Currently, there are approximately 16,000 workers at the site. With additional development of **University of Colorado Hospital, The Children's Hospital**, Colorado Science + Technology Park at Fitzsimons, and the new Veterans Affairs Hospital, employment on the site is expected to reach more than 44,500. Expansion of the interchange is critical to the effective and efficient operation of all the facilities on the Anschutz Medical Campus and the Fitzsimons Life Science District.
