

Introduction

N early 20 years ago, the Aurora Chamber of Commerce launched Leadership Aurora to educate local leaders from diverse backgrounds about our city and to prepare them for greater community involvement. Since then, nearly 600 people committed to shaping Aurora's future have graduated from the program.

Once a month for nine consecutive months, the Leadership Aurora class attends a daylong session that centers on a community theme such as education, healthcare or our urban infrastructure and economy. Firstrate presenters address related topics, encourage thoughtful dialogue and provide remarkable opportunities for on-site participation. Class members learn about the city's strengths and challenges, and the expectation of servant leadership intrinsic to healthy community development. In addition, each class chooses a project (or projects) of its own design to help local organizations that need it. Leadership Aurora is one of more than 1,000 community leadership programs in the nation. It is a member of the Community Leadership Association, a non-profit 501(c)3 organization dedicated to leadership development. Sponsored by the Aurora Chamber of Commerce, Leadership Aurora is funded by the Chamber, in-kind donations and class tuition. The Leadership Aurora Board steers the program, develops the curriculum and oversees its success.

Drop a pebble in the water; just a splash, and it is gone; But there's half-a-hundred ripples circling on and on, Spreading from the center, flowing on out to the sea. And there is no way of telling where the end is going to be. As I sat down to write this letter, I was initially overwhelmed with the prospect of trying to capture nine months of events in a few brief paragraphs. How could I hope to distill the experiences and various projects we participated in without making it sound trite?

> Then the answer came to me: Rather than merely catalog the events of the past year, I thought of using a metaphor. The excerpt above, from the poem <u>A Pebble</u>, by James W. Foley, captures my feelings about the experiences we have shared as the Class of 2004.

Just like in the poem, we were pebbles that were first dropped into the water (or should I say squirted by water) during our class retreat in Winter Park. Very quickly there was interaction and impact between the ripples from the numerous pebbles. Some ripples cancelled each other

out, while others fed upon the energy and grew larger. We were 35 individuals, with varying degrees of knowledge about our community, who wanted to experience, learn and give more. While we churned the waters with healthy debates and inquiries, we also learned to "share the love". Relationships and contacts were developed that grew throughout the year.

Collectively, seven monthly projects were completed which included distributing Halloween bags for the children in the Colfax Community Network, donations of cereal and gloves for the Comitis Crisis Center, adopting families during the holidays, providing diapers for the children in daycare at William Smith High School, donating money to DAVA for the purchase of art supplies and providing children's books for the Live and Learn program.

In addition to these monthly projects we also participated in two large class projects, a Bowl-a-Thon, where we bowled and raised more than \$650 dollars for Sungate, which provides services needed by child victims during and after an investigation of abuse. Our second class project involved a donation of \$3000 and part of a weekend helping rehabilitate a home in Aurora as part of National Rebuilding Together Day. Like the ripples in the poem, the activities and projects we participated in will continue to reverberate throughout the wonderful community of Aurora.

We owe our gratitude and sincere thanks to the Leadership Aurora Board, volunteers and hosts, and especially Kimberly Curtis. All of the hard work and effort that went into each session was instrumental in helping us become successful in our endeavors.

Each and every one of you has disturbed a mighty river just by dropping in a stone, let this continue beyond your experience with Leadership Aurora and never cease to imagine the impact you can make as a leader!

Our November session was all about healthcare. This session educated our class on local health care issues and national health care industry trends that impact our community. We began our day on the amazing Fitzsimons campus, where University of Colorado Hospital CEO, Dennis Brimhall, explained to us the history and status of the Fitzsimons Redevelopment Project. This partnership between public, private and governmental entities collectively bringing resources and working together on the largest medical redevelopment project in the United States, is a great example of leaders working together to promote positive change.

Dr. J.J. Cohen gave us a taste of the Mini Med School he and CU Health Sciences Center's Office of Public Relations designed and has sponsored in the metro area since 1990. Victor Spitzer, Director of the CU Center for Human Simulation, introduced us to the "Visible Human" – 1,877 cross-sectioned images of an actual human's body in one-millimeter intervals.

We were transported to the Medical Center of Aurora, by Rural/Metro ambulances, where we were "treated" to an eye-opening lunch. Each class member was assigned a specific disability for the buffet-style lunch and we experienced first-hand how difficult ordinary, every-day tasks can be for people with disabilities. We also engaged in tough but thought-provoking conversations about ethical decisions that medical providers often have to deal with.

By the end of the day we understood how much healthcare impacts our community. It was reinforced by the fact that our Emergency Department tour was cancelled due to the recent flu outbreak.

Then our teams picked up the hoses and actually experienced putting out a fire.
