INTRODUCTION

Since 1984 the Aurora Chamber of Commerce has promoted and fostered the development of leaders in our community. Leadership Aurora is a program designed to meet our city's need for the active participation of informed, skilled, and involved community leaders. As a result, Leadership Aurora educates and prepares community leaders who are committed to shaping Aurora's future.

The Class of 2012 brought together 36 future leaders, all with diverse backgrounds, and in ten months, created a group of united leaders to build a stronger Aurora for tomorrow. In the end, all 36 are committed to continuing to shape Aurora's future.

Leadership Aurora begins each September with a class retreat that includes social activities, team building exercises, and leadership seminars. After the retreat, the class meets once a month for the next nine months. Topics are presented by prominent individuals from the public and private sectors. Additional activities include case studies, site visits, interactive and "handson" experience.

Participants also work in teams on projects of their own design to provide tangible solutions to various community challenges. The community actually becomes the classroom. In addition to the monthly session, each Leadership Aurora class chooses a project (or projects) designed to help local organizations address their needs or the needs of the community.

Leadership Aurora is one of more than 1,000 community programs in the nation, and a member of the Association of Leadership Professionals, a non-profit 501(c) [3] organization dedicated to leadership development. Sponsored by the Aurora Chamber of Commerce, Leadership Aurora is funded by The Chamber, in-kind donations and class tuition. The Leadership Aurora Board steers the program, develops the curriculum and oversees its success.

We congratulate all Leadership Aurora graduates and commend their dedication to serving Aurora and influencing its ongoing progress toward becoming a world-class city.




"Community Ties and You"

Hougen, Aurora Chamber President & CEO, gave us an overview of Aurora's diversified economy and growth in Agriculture, Tourism, Aerospace, Bio-Science, Financial Services and Air Transport. He also talked about new initiatives that include the Gaylord Hotel development, The National Western Stock Show's interest in property near Aurora and the Horizon Uptown development.

Dave Chambers, Aurora's Director of Public Works, discussed that with growth comes the need for a sound infrastructure that includes IT services, schools, power, water, sewer, and roads. Aurora City Manager George "Skip" Noe discussed municipal government structure over the last century and as always, class members were quick to ask very challenging questions. The group's insights were put to use in a mock city council session held after the presentations. Whether educators are teaching select S.T.E.M. courses or discovering cures for diseases, Education Day emphasized the importance of health and education in our society. We have some of the best and brightest, with Aurora leading the way.



Our Healthcare Session was eve opening and inspiring. From the moment we arrived for breakfast to the time we left, we were emerged in the world of modern medical care.

During breakfast, class members learned what life is like for people with

various disabilities and diseases. Spalding Rehabilitation Hospital staff assigned a medical condition to each of us and we had to cope with that disability while we ate. We also had the opportunity to talk with people who have experienced disabilities. We certainly gained a greater appreciation for our own health!

Next, we split into two groups. Half of the class went to the Medical Center of Aurora -South Campus, where they toured the Cardio Catheter Lab, met the DaVinci robot, and learned step-by-step about the care given to a heart attack victim, from the moment the ambulance arrives until they are in recovery.

The rest of the class traveled to the University of Colorado Medical Center, where they had a sobering tour of the burn unit and heard stories from the professionals who work there.

The groups then reconvened, and spent time with the people who are responsible for transporting patients to medical care: Air Life and Rural/Metro EMS. We also learned the basics of CPR, how to help choking victims, and heard an overview about bioethics. The session ended with a moving presentation from class member Marilee Roybal Verdun's daughter, Chloe, who talked about her battle with juvenile diabetes.

"Pride & Presence"

The theme for our Military Session was "Pride and Presence," and listening to the military personnel who spoke to us made it clear that Buckley Air Force Base brings both of these things to our community. Pride was evident in each of their explanations of what they do, what their units do every day, and how much work is involved to make it all appear seamless, both to US citizens and local citizens of Aurora. Presence is what the community feels, but it's much more than that. These men and women are responsible for ensuring that the community at large is safe and protected.

Brigadier General Trulon Eyre commands the Colorado Air National Guard (COANG), 140th Wing. He spoke passionately about the Air National Guard's mission. He also talked about the history of COANG, which is storied and impressive.

Colonel Daniel Dant oversees the US Air Force 460th Space Wing, which operates the "golf balls" on the base. He described the Wing's responsibility for tracking not only missiles on a global level, but also more than 23,000 items in orbit around the earth.

We enjoyed a tour of the F-16 inspection hangar and learned about this aircraft's role in COANG. We see these planes overhead regularly, and it was a treat to be able to touch one and peer into its cockpit.

A tour of the Army Aviation Support Facility, hosted by Capt. Troy Brown, gave us



the opportunity to observe Blackhawk helicopters up close, along with other aircraft that COANG uses in its operations.

With more than 12,000 personnel and an economic impact of more than \$1 billion annually, our military has a great influence on Aurora and helps make it a great place to live.

"In the Line of Fire"

On a misty day in April we met at the Aurora Police Academy where we were welcomed by Capt. Fran Gomez who works directly with Police Chief Dan Oates. She gave us an overview of the Aurora Police Department's mission, values and goals. Aurora is the 58th largest city in the country, with over 320,000 citizens. This translates into a very busy full-service Police Department.

We heard presentations from the heads of several of those departments including

Traffic, DART (Direct Action Response Team), the Gang Intervention Unit and 911 Dispatch. In comparison to cities with similarly sized populations, Aurora's crime rate is noticeably lower than the average.

After a short break, we headed to the Training Academy Gymnasium for a demonstration of "less lethal" weapons including tasers and firearms which shoot rubber bullets and bean bags. They may be less lethal, but we'd surrender. We then broke into smaller groups and took turns in the simulation room where a scenario was played out on a large screen and the group's vocal commands and physical actions determined the outcome of the scenario.

Our afternoon was spent at the Police Shooting Range where we met several SWAT officers and had an opportunity to shoot M-4 and M-16 rifles, observe a SWAT sniper in action, explore the department's armored vehicle, the Bear, and meet K-9 officers who demonstrated the skills and training it takes to find hidden explosives and drugs, and detain bad guys.

It is clear that the 644 members of the APD are passionate about creating and maintaining a safe, peaceful community.



FIRE

"Where There's Smoke, There's Fire"

Many class members were looking forward to Fire Day and no one was disappointed. We reported to the Rocky Mountain Fire Academy and started by getting fitted with full bunker gear for the afternoon activities. Fire Chief Mike Garcia spoke with us about how important it is for fire rescue personnel to build friendships with each other. He also pointed out that without a safe city nothing else matters. Next, class member and Fire Department

Battalion Chief, Scott Mills spoke about the elements of the Department's Special Operations team, which he oversees. Battalion Chief Mark Stephenson then taught and demonstrated how fire behaves and made us aware of some of the dangerous substances transported through Aurora. Deputy Chief Tony Cito finished the classroom presentations with an overview of the Fire Department's organization.

After a delicious barbeque lunch, grilled by the AFD Executive Staff, we divided into groups and participated in six training activities: automobile extrication; smoke search and rescue; confined space maze; car fire extinguishing; technical rescue from a five-story building; and an aerial climb to 100 feet in the bucket of a rescue truck.

In addition to learning about the structure and function of the Fire Department, many class members faced and overcame some of their fears with the support of their team members. We all walked away with a greater appreciation for the men and women of Aurora Fire Department and their dedication to keeping us safe.




