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


Board Chair



Class Projects



The Leadership Aurora Class of 2016 committed themselves in helping the families of victims from the 2012 Aurora Theater Shooting, to help raise additional funds for the future memorial garden. The class set up an online silent auction, along with collecting donations directly to the fundraiser site, successfully raising \$11,756, pulling off a record for Leadership Aurora fundraising, on a single class project!



After an inspiring Community Day, the class determined what their first project would be and collected 747 pairs of socks and over 100 pairs of gloves to donate to local homeless shelters.


Education Day


